Medical Tourism Report

A new report 'Understanding the Health and Safety Risks for British Columbia's Outbound Medical Tourists' has been prepared by a research team led by Valorie Crooks of Simon Fraser University.

Medical tourism is the practice of travelling abroad to privately purchase medical care. Risks include medical complications, (un)informed decision-making, transmission of infectious disease via transplantation, transmission of antibiotic resistant organisms, personal safety risks, and (dis)continuity of care. Provincial Hand Hygiene Project

New Hand Hygiene Project Manager

Robin Wilson has joined the PICNet team as project manager for the hand hygiene study we're collaborating in. The project will support the Provincial Hand Hygiene Working Group through a healthcare worker hand hygiene perception survey, and will evaluate the implementation of a province-wide hand hygiene program.

About the Hand Hygiene Project

It is well known that hand hygiene is important in protecting patients; however, less attention has been paid to its ability to protect healthcare workers. Thanks to a grant from WorkSafeBC, in November 2011 the Provincial Hand Hygiene Working Group (PHHWG) launched a two-year research project looking at just that.

Hand Hygiene Survey - January 2012

In January, an electronic survey will be sent out to healthcare staff working in acute care settings. This survey, along with key informant interviews, will provide the baseline for understanding the impact of the provincial program. The results will be reported back to the PHHWG and the Health Authorities to ensure that the program is meeting the needs and realities of workers.
