Objective

To improve physician hand hygiene adherence by recruiting physicians to become **HH Champions**

Methods

- Recruitment and physician engagement
- Participation and Qualitative Research – Preparation
 - Focus Group
- Continuation of HH audits, physician focused reporting, and physician engagement

Preparation

- WHO Knowledge and Perception survey
- NEJM Hand hygiene Video
- WHO Technical Ref Manual



Focus Group Questions

- Do you believe HH is important?
- Are you aware of our HH campaigns?
- What can PHC do to improve your adherence to HH?
- Do you think your adherence to HH influences the behavior of others?
- What do you think of the "Ask Me Campaign"

Results

• **103 physicians (11% of active staff members)** from the following medical/surgical specialties completed phase II of the project

Key Findings

- The project has identified physician knowledge gaps and perceived barriers (cognitive, social, structural, organizational) to improved HH
- Physician HH Champions are recognized by their unit as the local experts in removing barriers to HH through their self initiated projects in the domains of: education, human factors engineering and changing social norms/behaviors
- In the fiscal quarter 4 audits (2011), physicians for the first time, did not have lower HH adherence compared to other HCWs
- Sustainability:
 - HH Champions Newsletter
 - Physician HH Champion initiated interventions
 Quarterly HH audits
