The Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) Regional Specialist is part of the Infection Prevention and Control department, and dedicated to supporting the IPAC program and Regional IPAC Initiatives within Interior Health (IH). The Specialist plays an active role as a member of the multidisciplinary team throughout the design of new programs from planning to final evaluation after work completion.

The Specialist is the primary lead for IPAC-related clinical and evidence-informed information, queries, and concerns. The Specialist works closely and in a consultative manner with stakeholders, consultants, and IH Partners, to support successful project and program outcomes. The Specialist is expected to attend required meetings from planning stages through to final stages of projects. The Specialist communicates about progress on a regular basis to: the senior leadership of the program or project, IPAC team, corporate departments, Medical Staff, facility leadership and staff. The Specialist actively participates in accreditation and/or licensing activities, training, and onsite evaluations as required.

This is a permanent full-time position. Days of work are Monday to Friday from 08:00 to 16:00 with weekends and stat holidays off. This position can be located at any Interior Health, ICP site/department.

- Current certification (CIC®) in infection control with the Certification Board for Infection Control and Epidemiology (CBIC).
