

Overview of Immunization Courses Housed on BCCDC

The BC Centre for Disease Control (BCCDC) hosts a range of online immunization courses available for free for BC health professionals. These courses range from providing theoretical and clinical understanding of immunology, vaccines and immunization practice to those that improve confidence in addressing questions and concerns parents have in relation to immunizations. The courses vary in length depending on the course itself and participant's previous level of knowledge. These courses have been developed by the BCCDC and/or by the British Columbia Immunization Committee (BCIC)'s Professional Education Working Group (PEWG).
